If you Google "labor shortage in construction industry," you'll turn up more than 1.34 million results – proof, if you needed it, that there is, indeed, a problem.

This problem stems from a number of circumstances. In recent years, skilled workers who couldn't obtain enough work during the slow-down abandoned our industry permanently when they found jobs elsewhere.



Many workers have aged out of jobs that require the strength and dexterity of younger people. Stringent immigration policies, increased border enforcement, and an improved Mexican economy all have resulted in fewer foreignborn workers coming into this country.

Some school districts have discontinued efforts to promote vocational training, so potential young workers haven't been receiving an introduction to the construction trades.

While you and your ASA can't change the realities of the first three reasons for our shortage of skilled craftspeople, we can and are doing something about vocational training. You'll find the details in *Hot Off the Press*.

► Prefab -- don't be left behind

When your next client wants to squeeze the schedule beyond the limitations of traditional construction, will your company be ready?

More and more owners and GCs are embracing prefabricated multi-trade subcontractor assemblies in order to meet condensed schedules, as well as to improve quality control, waste control, worker efficiency, and worker safety.

If the decision to use multi-trade prefab is made after the initial bid process, its incorporation into the project can require certain subs to reduce scope in order to make room for the prefabricated components. As a result, subs are often justifiably resistant to prefabrication. Thus collaboration and planning for prefab early in the design phase is absolutely key.



Other points are worth considering as well:

- The use of BIM is critical for prefab projects.
- Creating mockups minimizes late changes.
- Sites with logistical or storage challenges are good candidates for prefab.
- Weather may matter less when prefab occurs offsite in a controlled environment.

Don't be left behind. When your next client puts on the pressure, be ready to collaborate in the prefab process.
